Music Streaming Service Launched: There is yet another way to experience great organ music online. The Organ Media Foundation has rolled out its third Internet streaming audio station, The Organ Experience. This station broadcasts classical organ music 24 hours a day via its website at http://www.organexperience.com/. A built-in web player automatically handles connecting listeners to the stream, and complete information about each work being played is displayed on the site. The Organ Media Foundation is a listener-supported non-profit 501(c)3 organization. All of its broadcasts are free to hear, and are commercial-free. This newest station joins the Organ Media Foundation's other two outlets, http://www.organlive.com/ and http://www.positivelybaroque.com/. All of these stations have their own web players, but are also available on internet radio devices, AppleTV, Roku, Iphone, Ipad, and Android devices.
